Excellence is an ever-approaching target and bedrock of any academic institution. This college has steadily, despite its humble beginning in 1968 kept a pragmatic approach. With undaunted determination & perseverance of its incumbents, this college has flourished over the years with single minded devotion of striving for innovation & excellence and reached a place where it can boast of quality education integrated with State-Of-The-Art infrastructure. The college was accredited with 'B' Grade by NAAC Peer team during their visit in year 2016. Post-graduation in Economic has also started in this college in the current session.

Nestled in the foot hills of Mt. Shivalik, the college campus is a jewel in the crown of the town. While preserving the natural ecology in form of botanical gardens & green cover, the campus is fully equipped with modern facilities to accommodate the rapidly growing strength of the students which stands at 3677 with 2227 girls and 1450 boys. 41 teachers and 21 members of ministerial and other support staff are working diligently and tirelessly to cater to the needs of students. Besides undergraduate courses in Arts, Commerce and Science, Post Graduate students in English, Pol. Science and Commerce also benefit from the existing facilities. Academics (General-Courses)

In a globally competitive environment, the academic parameters are evolving continuously to suit the ever-changing requirements of limitless possibilities. Staying abreast with the time changing paradigms in teaching learning process, the college has adopted a holistic approach. Sound systems have been installed in most of the class-rooms. Ten new rooms have been provided with overhead projectors and screens. Keeping pace with the ever-increasing need of technology in education six rooms have been equipped with Digital Smart Boards in the current session. Teachers of all departments have been provided with laptops so that they stay technologically upgraded. The campus boasts of Wi-Fi facility. In addition to classroom learning, the students are being exposed to different aspects of personality development through participation in the activities of clubs and societies, thus providing them with a platform to explore and expand their intellectual horizons.

Graduate & Post Graduate Courses

Activities conducted by Professional Courses

Department of BBA

The department is successfully imparting professional education to students since 2008. In this academic year, the total seats in the department were raised from 60 to 80 by Himachal Pradesh University. Excelling in academics, more than 85% of our students obtained 1st division in the university exam. The department conducted several activities besides academics to groom the students in order to meet the challenges of rapidly changing business in the globalized world. A two day 'Talent Hunt Programme' was organized in which a great number of students participated and won positions in various competitions such as Rangoli, Quiz, Declamation etc.



Department of BCA

The BCA Department organized various academic and co-curricular activities throughout the year for the all-round development of the students. These activities provided a refreshing break from the monotony of routine work and also a platform thereby exploring recreational talent among the students.

Department of B.Voc

The department of B.Voc is providing two courses namely 'Retail Management' and 'Hospitality and Tourism' with 40 seats in each stream. Separate laboratories have been established for both the courses. Time to time Guest lectures are conducted by industry experts from for both streams which help them in grooming and skill development. The department conducted various activities during the session such as: -

Department of MBA

MBA department organized Seven days Orientation programme 'Parichay' for the new students in the beginning of the new session. Multifarious activities such as one month Summer Internship training was organized to equip them with the current corporate protocol. In the month of November, a Sports day was organized at JNV Pekhvela and a Campus Placement drive in the month of March 2021 was organized.



Various guest lectures by eminent personalities related to the curriculum and general topics were organized from time to time. Besides MOUs with different industries in the district were signed to facilitate students for Internship Programme and placements. About 12 students were placed in different positions in the private as well as public sector.

Department of MCA

The MCA department organized a 21 days Technical Workshop in September- October 2021 on Python, Django & Bootstrap framework in which students learned to develop minor projects. A three days Orientation Programme 'Resonance-21' was organized in the month of November. Tree plantation drive and campus beautification campaign were organized to make the students aware of and concerned about the ecological imbalance in nature. Students participated and bagged prizes in various activities held in the college from time to time.



A new dress code for MCA Students was initiated in February 2022. Various guest lectures on general and curriculum related topics were held to apprise the students with the latest developments and to cope up with the rapidly changing psychological and professional environment. Besides MOU's were signed with different companies and about 25 students of the department were placed in different private companies.





IELTS Training Programme

Under the first component of Utkrisht Mahavidyalaya Yojana, two batches of 40 students each were given IELTS training under the convenorship of Dr. Meeta Sharma, dept. of English. Realizing that there is an increasing trend of students aspiring to go abroad for employment and Higher Education, it was decided that the training of IELTS would be helpful for such students. This being an expensive course outside, the college offered this course entirely free of cost. The response of students was overwhelming.

Cultural Activities

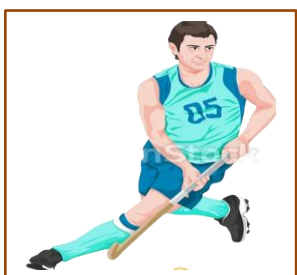
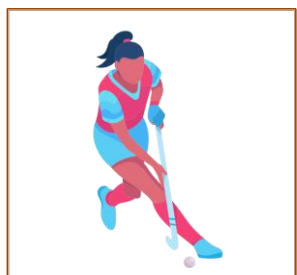


Cultural activities are an integral part of any formal education. College being a temple of learning is also a custodian of cultural heritage and moral values that are imperative for character building.

Clubs/Societies & Activities

Eco Club

The Eco Club of the college kept students engaged in various activities throughout the academic year such as clay modeling, pot decoration, best from waste which was organized on the theme "Environment and Technology". A Vaccine Drive for the prevention of Corona was also undertaken.

Red Ribbon Club

Red Ribbon club of the college remained active throughout the year under the convenorship of Prof. Smt Shashi Kanwari. In association with the District Health dept, Red Ribbon Club organized various activities during the session.

1. Women Cell

2. Dr. Navita Sharma (Member, Women Cell) attended One day district level workshop on Sexual harassment at Work Place (Prevention, prohibition and redressal) Act 2013 on 9th December, 2021 to commemorate the 8th anniversary of notification of Act.
3. Two cases filed for redressal in the Women Cell were amicably resolved with proper counselling and to the satisfaction of complainants and their parents.
4. International Women's Day was celebrated on 8 th March by organizing various competitions like handicrafts exhibition, clay modeling, dance, poster making and slogan writing. In this event, two local Women entrepreneurs promoted their Food Stalls in the campus.

5. A first of its kind, Handicrafts group of students of college, mostly girls was organized to tap the talent in crafting beautiful handmade articles. In future, the cell endeavors to promote this talent under the aegis of District Language, Art and Culture Department.

Anti-Ragging Committee

It aims at grooming students into models of discipline and helps in the development of their character, leadership qualities, a secular outlook and the spirit of self-sacrifice to the nation.

Two units of NCC under Lieut. (Dr.) Ashwini Kumar and Lieut. Monika Khanna are working efficiently in our college. Parade Practice is held every weekend in the college and our cadets excel in complex drill formations. Besides, our cadets participated in various social activities throughout the year.

National Service Scheme (NSS)

With the vision "Educated Youth & Self – Reliant India", two units of NSS are being run in the college with the strength of 200 (100 Boys & 100 Girls) volunteers under the guidance of two programme officers, Dr. Rajender Kumar & Prof. Shiv Kumar. Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU)



To advance and disseminate learning and knowledge by diversity of means without any bias to all sections of society, the Learner Support Centre 1109 of Indira Gandhi National Open University at Govt. P.G. College, Una was established in 1996.

The continuous efforts put in by Regional Directors, Principals, Coordinators, Counselors, Staff and the hard work of learners for the last 25 years has resulted in continuous growth of this centre as a result of which it has emerged as one of the largest study Centre in Himachal Pradesh in terms of learners' strength. At present this center is operational

with Prof. Devinder Kumar as Coordinator and Prof. Rakesh Kumar and Dr. Vinod Kumar as Assistant Coordinators. In the current session 2443 students have been enrolled. The center conducts induction meetings, counseling, assignment evaluation, term end examinations, and provides extension and support facilities for its learners.

This study Centre provides distance learning facilities to all those who are deprived of regular studies

Library, PTA & OSA

Library



The college library stocking a prodigious collection of 22200 books, subscription of 33 journals 16 magazines and 13 newspapers, endeavors to be a repository of knowledge. It is playing a vital role in educating students to become skilled, effective and responsible information users so that they know how to use it effectively, efficiently and ethically. The library resources are being automated using SOUL library software.

An NLIST service, the e-resources provided by the INFLIBNET has been subscribed for the use of faculty and students. Digital section of the library is operational where Virtual Learning Resource Centre with excellent State- Of -The-Art computer facilities having 6 Internet connected terminals with Local Area Network (LAN) have been installed.

Parents Teachers Association (PTA)



A Parents Teachers Association is functioning smoothly in the college under the Presidentship of Sh. Rakesh Vashisth. The PTA, through its invaluable support makes a positive contribution in sustaining the quality of educational transactions that take place in the college. Their constructive criticism and valuable feedback have always been helpful and appreciated. In the current session, renovation of BCA Hall was undertaken. 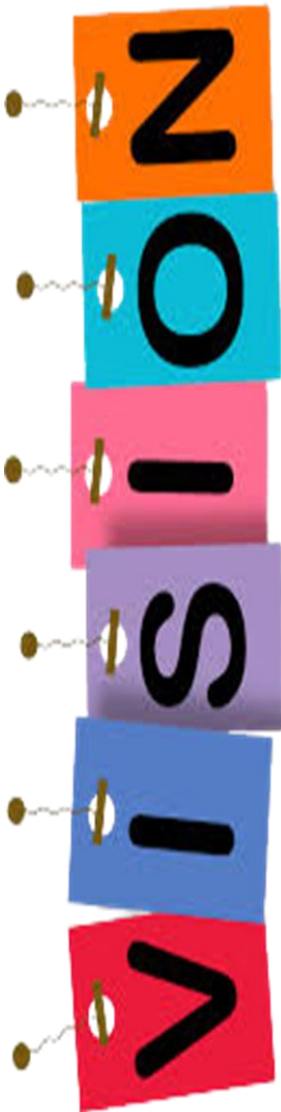
